Grammar notes (English)

This section explains the main grammar points used in the Spanish paragraphs above. Focus is on the present tense and common verbs and expressions that describe routines and preferences.

Present tense to describe routines and habits

Use the simple present to talk about regular actions: **Me encanta, hago, me despierto, escucho**. These forms are the backbone of describing what you normally do on weekends.

Reflexive verbs

Verbs like **despertarse** and **levantarse** are reflexive. Example: **Me despierto tarde** means "I wake up late." The reflexive pronoun (me, te, se) goes before the conjugated verb.

Expressing preferences

Use verbs like **gustar** with indirect object pronouns to express likes: **Me gustan**, **Me encanta**. Note that the verb form depends on what you like (singular or plural): **Me gusta leer** vs **Me gustan las películas**.

4. **Write a short paragraph** imagining a special weekend. Include at least two activities from the description above (visitar un museo, ir de compras, cocinar).
