

Spanish -AR Verb Conjugation Maze Game (Preterite Tense)

The preterite tense can be challenging for Spanish learners, but adding movement and game-based practice makes conjugation review far more engaging. This -AR Verb Conjugation Maze Game gives students a fun way to reinforce preterite endings while problem-solving their way through a puzzle.

This activity works well as a warm-up, partner game, station activity, fast-finisher option, or review before assessment.

Objective

Move from START to FINISH by correctly [conjugating -AR verbs in the preterite tense](#).

How to Play

1. Students begin at the START space.
2. They may move up, down, left, or right—but only if they correctly conjugate the verb in the space they want to enter.
3. Each space contains a subject pronoun and an -AR verb in the infinitive.
4. Students must say or write the correct preterite form before moving.
5. The first player to reach FINISH wins.
6. Teachers may require written answers, verbal responses, or partner-checking depending on the class.

Why This Activity Works

- It's easy to differentiate by adjusting required accuracy or adding time limits.

Extensions and Variations

- Have students create their own maze using different -AR verbs.
- Use -ER or -IR verbs, irregular preterite verbs, or mixed tenses.
- Turn it into a race, relay, or team challenge.
- Require complete-sentence answers for added challenge.
- Use it as homework by having students write the path they chose.
