

Spanish Verb Conjugation Maze Game (Conditional Tense)

The conditional tense is an important structure for expressing hopes, hypothetical situations, polite requests, and what someone “would” do. This maze-style conjugation game offers students a fun and interactive way to practice forming the conditional—turning grammar review into a puzzle challenge.

This activity is great for partner work, warm-ups, stations, fast-finishers, or as an engaging review before assessments.

Objective

Move from START to FINISH by correctly [conjugating verbs](#) in the conditional tense.

How to Play

1. Begin at the START space.
2. You may move up, down, left, or right, but only if you correctly [conjugate the verb](#) in the space using the conditional tense.
3. Each space includes a subject pronoun and an infinitive.
4. Students must say or write the correct conditional form to move on.
5. The first player to reach FINISH wins.

Why This Activity Works

- Reinforces conditional endings through repeated meaningful practice.
- Helps students distinguish regular from irregular conditional forms.
- The maze structure adds strategy and movement, increasing engagement.
- Works for independent, partner, or competitive gameplay.
- Easy to differentiate by requiring complete sentences or timed rounds.

Ideas for Extension

- Have students write a short “What would you do?” paragraph using the verbs from their path.
- Require full-sentence responses for an added challenge.
- Ask students to create their own conditional tense maze.
- Combine this maze with others (present, preterite, imperfect) for a mixed-tense station activity.
