

Spanish Verb Conjugation Maze Game (Present Subjunctive)

The present subjunctive is one of the most important—and often most challenging—verb forms for Spanish learners. Students rely on it to express wishes, emotions, recommendations, doubt, and uncertainty. Because mastering the subjunctive requires repeated exposure, this maze-style conjugation game offers a fun and interactive way to build accuracy and confidence.

This activity works well for Spanish 3, Spanish 4, AP Spanish, or any level beginning subjunctive study.

Objective

Move from START to FINISH by correctly conjugating verbs in the present subjunctive.

How to Play

1. Begin at the START space.
2. You may move up, down, left, or right—but only if you correctly conjugate the verb in the present subjunctive.
3. Each space includes a subject pronoun and a verb in the infinitive.
4. Say or write the correct form to move forward.
5. First player or team to reach FINISH wins.
